AHF Congressional Reception and Award Ceremony

Dear Friend:

You are cordially invited to attend a Congressional Reception on October 19, 2005 as the American Hungarian Federation (AHF) begins a year of commemorations leading up to the 50th anniversary of the 1956 Hungarian Revolution in 2006. As the date approaches, AHF feels it is important to recognize those individuals that continue to contribute to the ideals of the Hungarian Revolution.

The American Hungarian Federation will confer upon both public and Congressional nominees the Federation's highest honor: the Colonel Commandant Michael (Mihály) Kováts de Fabriczy Medal of Freedom for lifetime achievements, contributions to society, and support of freedom and democracy.

The Congressional reception will begin at 6:30 pm in the Rayburn House Office
Building Dining Room on Capitol Hill. The Rayburn building is located southwest of the Capitol on a site
bounded by Independence Avenue, South Capitol Street, First Street, and C Street, S.W. It is Metro
accessible from the Capitol South Station. A map is also attached.

The American Hungarian Federation, founded in 1906, is one of the nation's oldest ethnic organizations representing Americans of Hungarian descent. AHF's Motto, "Faithful Unto Death," was taken from a letter to Benjamin Franklin written by the Father of the US Cavalry when he offered his sword in service to the United States. The former Hussar Officer, Mihaly Kováts, whose life and service is celebrated annually by US Military Cadets at the Citadel, died in battle against the British in Charleston, S.C. in 1779. Our Motto reflects our virtues and historically and inextricably ties Hungarians and Americans together and symbolizes Hungarian contributions to America right from the start.
